The Club's name "Iron Cove & Balmain District Tigers", was chosen for its affiliation to the area and the old Balmain Tigers Football Leagues Club & the Balmain & District Cricket Club (Tigers), now Sydney CC. The Club also incorporates the Balmain District in its secondary name; Balmain & District Tigers.

The Committee were determined to be known as "Tigers" and be recognised as a Community based Club. The "Tigers" want to get back to the local area, support local businesses and create a true Club environment for Juniors and Seniors alike.

The Club will also focus on training and playing on local grounds in the Inner West. Developing Junior talent and providing a pathway to Senior Cricket.

### THE DISTRICT ALSO HAS A LONG HISTORY WITH OUR FIRST NATIONS PEOPLE IN THE SYDNEY DISTRICT.

The Club recognizes the Wangai people that originally inhabited the country now known as Leichhardt Municipality. The history of Aboriginal people in the Sydney, Leichhardt area is, without doubt, a hidden one. What we know today as the Sydney Municipality & Inner West Municipality, was once the area inhabited by the Wangal band of the Dharug (Eora) language group.

The "Eora people" was the name given to coastal Aborigines around Sydney - Eora means "from this place" - local Aboriginal people used this word to describe to Europeans where they came from, and in time the term became used to define Aboriginal people themselves. Wangal country was known as wanne and it originally extended from the suburbs of Balmain and Birchgrove in the east to Silverwater and Auburn in the west. We pay Respect to their forebears and those current peoples.





#### By-Law 2 of the Constitution.

## IRON COVE & BALMAIN DISTRCT TIGERS CRICKET CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. A Person or Persons must not behave in a manner detrimental to the spirit of the game of Cricket, or to bring the club or the game into disrepute.
- 2. Those Persons referred to can be either participants in the game, Spectators, Parents or Partners of Players.
- 3. That a Person or Persons must not;
- a. Assault or attempt to assault an Umpire, another player or a spectator, be it a senior or junior person.
- b. Abuse, either verbally or physically, another player, Umpire or a spectator, be it a junior or senior person or use language that is discriminative on the basis of race, gender or sexuality.
- c. Dispute, as distinct from question, an Umpires' decision or react in an obviously provocative or disapproving manner towards an Umpire, his decision, or generally following an Umpires' decision.
- d. Use crude or abusive language, or engage in any form of conduct detrimental to the spirit of the game, or likely to bring the game into disrepute.
- e. Use crude or abusive hand signals or other gestures.
- f. Abuse, mentally or physically a child under their care, by use of physical force, coercion, verbal and bullying manner.
- g. Participate in the use of Alcohol or any other substance that is detrimental to theirs or others performance, whilst playing, especially in front of Juniors under the age of 18 years.
- h. Refuse to supply his or her full name and registered address, to the local or District Cricket Association, such as a Club official, Association official or local Council officials or members of the Police Force, when required by that person who is eligible to lodge a report of an incident concerning conduct that is unbecoming of the Club or Association.
- i. The person or persons who are in breach of this code will be dealt with, firstly, by the Club Committee, and then if required by the appropriate Cricket Association under whose jurisdiction the competition is conducted.
- J. Use of electronic media to engage in actions that would be detrimental to the conduct of the game or against the spirit of Cricket or to bring the game into disrepute.

Either of these authorities will administer the appropriate penalty handed according to the severity of the Breach.

They are not up to scratch, but the council are proposing under the masterplan for the Park to upgrade the nets.

Next season, we will move to Easton Park and the new Rozelle Parkland so that our Balmain/Rozelle based teams can train.

Lastly, I would like to thank all of those members of the committee, Sarah Short, Jason Fasone, David Sallway, Cameron Roberts, Jennifer Stuart, Sanjeevan Agniswaran, Mitchell Smith and not least but our President Warwick King, who was a stalwart in organization last season, including organizing the Bunnings BBQ.

#### Notes to Accounts.

#### Note 1. Sponsors.

Two Sponsors made up the bulk of the sponsorship receivables. the Drummoyne Sailing Club & Debt Brokers. This is \$10K short of what our expectations were for the Season.

#### Note 2. Coaching Camp.

We did not run a Boot Camp this season, due mainly to rain.

#### Note 3.

A. This season we run a Raffle that included, Signed CNSW Bats and an IPad with the Junior presentation that netted us \$1000 over costs.

- B. We run a Bunnings event at Balmain Bunnings this pre season which was a great success and look forward to doing it again.
- C. We had a Merch offer this season in Stubbies and a Baggy Caps.
- D. We ran the Big Bash offer from CNSW for the Thunder, Rain interrupted the events.

#### Note 4. Internet Web Costs.

A yearly subscription from the website Provider Wix. Wix is also the platform by which PlayHQ, the Cricket Australia operating platform is built and it made our page seamless with registrations and notices through PlayHQ.

This coming season the cost should be cheaper as we reorganised our Web Server through Wix after having problems with the the server.

#### Note 5. Equipment Purchases.

This for purchase of Kits and relevant equipment. Balls and miscellaneous equipment for running the Coaching. As we have built a stock of equipment over the last couple of seasons, we should only need to refurbish existing equipment and the biggest expense are Cricket Balls.

#### Note 6. General Expenses & Printing.

These costs incorporate, printing for Banners & Corflute's. Stubby Costs, Locks, Thumb Drives for Coaching, the Ipad, etc.

#### Note 7. Entertainment & Social Expenses.

These costs are for the season launch, the Xmas Party for Seniors, the Junior and Senior Presentation drinks and dinner, plus general entertaining for meetings etc.

#### Note 8. Admin fees.

This is Secretarial Fees for the Season at \$300mth.

#### Note 9. Coaching Costs.

The Fees are less this season, as the need for full team Coaching from outside Coaches was not as necessary.

#### A GRADE RESERVE TEAM REPORT

The A Grade Reserve Team had a great season after an interesting circumstance where our team was elevated from B Grade to A grade along with 6 other B Grade sides. We had a strong pre-season organised by Club Captain Mitch Smith which saw the team commence with strong performances in the opening round, prior seasons we have been slow to find form however this was abated in this season.

The matches prior to daylight savings saw us start with reduced 32 over matches to finish the match prior to dark and often saw teams rushing through overs, we lost to St Matthews A Grade in the opening round by 22 runs. We had a fill-in opener who top scored with 49 runs and Mitch Smith performed well picking up 3 wickets. In the following match we played St Andrews Parramatta CC A Grade White picking up our first win of the season. Alex (Sandy) Henderson registered in First 50 of the season and also saw our Captain Warwick King pick up 3 wickets. The season then moved into a break for the Grand Final (NRL and AFL).

Following the break we moved into Round 3 against LWCC who were winless up to this point of the season, they produced a brilliant performance which saw Iron Cove Restricted to 131 with Mitch Smith top scoring with 33 however it wasn't the bowlers day with only 2 wickets taken. Round 4 saw Mitch Smith continue with his rich vein of form scoring 68 against Ashfield Cricket Club however it wasn't enough with Ashfield winning by 3 wickets.

Round 5 saw an incredible showdown against India Avenue. Short on players India Avenue fell 3 runs short with overs to spare. Sam Weigh opened well making 43 runs and was well supported in the middle order by Preston Davis with a 68 posting an imposing total of 196. Sam Weight was the pick of the bowles taking 3 for 19 to help pave the way to Victory. Nick Schatz as stand in captain saw the unwavering nerve of the team see through to victory. Round saw a forfeit by Gladesville.

Round 7 in soggy, wet conditions saw an incredible game of cricket with the Tigers scoring an incredible 275 (their highest of the season) with CCC St Peters competing well by making 265 runs. Sandy Henderson 72, Sam Weight 85 and Preston Davis unbeaten on 40 saw the top 4 perform incredibly well to post the huge total.

Bowling was tough with 2 of the top 3 opposition batsman scoring centuries however they fell short in the chase as conditions improved and the ball holding up in the second innings better.

Round 8 was a tough game against Castle Hill Wesley in scorching condition in WEstern Sydney seeing the Tiger bamboozled by looping legspin to be bowled out for 59, Warwick King took 3/20 as the pick of the bowlers in a tough match. Round 9 saw another thrilling Tigers Victoriy against the A Grade Premiers of 22/23 with a 2 run win, Saw Weight led the way with the ball taking 4/35 whilst A fill in scored 42 and Alex Kennedy support with 35 not out.

Round 10 - 12 saw a lean patch on no victories. Round 10 returning back to the Fortress in a one sided affair against the B Grade Victors of season 22/23. Sandy Henderson (39) and Denis Curnow (52) where the only shining lights on this tough day with only 2 of their wickets taken. Round 11 St Andrews Parramatta saw 2 wickets each go to Zac Cowan, Denis Curnow and Sam Weight however with the bat only Alex Kenndy managed to score above 30 with 33 runs and Nick Schatz support 27. Round 12saw another close loss to St Matthews A Grade, Mitch Smith scored the highest with 31, but healthy contributions from Sandy Henderson (25), Sanjeevan Agniswaran (27\*) and Zac Cowan (20\*). The bowling proved the challenge with 7 wickets shared over 5 bowlers.

Post the CHristmas break Round 13 came around with a poor game where St Andrews CC A Grade WHite chased our 70 runs in 10 overs, Sandy Henderson scoring an unbeaten 28\* was the only upside in a challenged match. Round 14 Against LWCC again saw the Tigers fall short with a strong bowling team strangling the Tigers run chase ability. 4 Wickets to Preston Davis was a tremendous effort and Denus CUrnow with 59 were some exception solo performances that were not enough to get across to the finish line still falling 41 runs short.

The Run into the finals from Round 16 to 18 saw the Tigers win 2 of the final 3 matches of the Home and Away Season. Sam Weight with 5/31 was an important performance to get the tigers into the match align witha 30 with the bat in arguably the best on ground performance. The batting of the tigers just wasn't all there to take on 173 made by India Avenue failing by 49 runs. Round 17 was a strong showing against a strengthening Gladesville Sporties, Sandy Henderson scored 55, Denis Curnow 44 in a brilliant batting performance setting a strong total of 184. The wickets were shared around with Sandy Henderson and a fill in starring with 3 wickets a piece. Round 18 saw the Tiger take on CCC St Peters in a low scoring afair with Sam Weight bowling with fear int he eyes of batsman with 2 batmsen eventually sent to hospital buy him, one with a helmet hit and another with a suspected fractured forearm - Mitch Smith benefited taking 4 wickets and making 33 runs opening with Sam Weight also making 28.

Finals Week Round 1 saw an immediate re-match between CCC St Peters. The Tigers posted an above par score of 7/203 from the allotted 35 Overs. Denis Curnow did the damage with the bat scoring a match defining 70 to setup the Tigers well in the first innings. The Opening bowlers bowled well picking up 3 wickets between then and a significant spell of 4/11 off 7 overs from Mitch Smith pushed the game beyond CCC St Peters capability. The game played in excellent spirit with both teams hanging back after the match for some drinks in the Five Dock Park pavilion.

Finals Week 2 saw the Tigers take on their arch-rivals who defeated them in the 22/23 Finals series. Unfortunately again the bowling attack of the LWCC Wanders was too good and heavily restricted the Tigers to only 82 off 28 overs. Sam Weight and Denis Curnow tried again to steer the Tigers to an unlikely Victory by taking 5 wickets in the opening spell however wickets became hard to come by the a slightly understrength bowling line-up after that and not enough runs on the board to defend, getting Leichhardt down 7 wickets was still not enough to save the day.

Over the Previous 2 seasons the Tigers have built quite a bit of depth in the A Grade Reserve team with some new players joining the Club in Denis Curnow, Alex Riccio to name a few who had some solid contributions through the season, we will look to top up the list with some further new off-season players. Well done to Alex Henderson with one of his finest seasons with the club to date, and Sam Weight coming off a strong previous season performing at another level with the bowl this season and Mitch Smith showing class with both bat and ball in strong all-rounder performances through the season. A big thank you goes to Nick Schatz for taking over the captaincy from me for the last half of the season following a several month ankle injury, we saw the

captaincy shared by 4 different players at different times this season due to availability challenges at different times adding to the leadership depth of this team for the future! It's been a pleasure playing with this team and I wish this team a well earned off-season and the greatest of successes for the 24/25 season to reach the ultimate glory!
